Long Beach City College (Long Beach, CA) is developing a hybrid one-stop resource for student parents and creating a multimedia outreach campaign to reach current and potential student parents in the community.



Los Angeles Valley College (Valley Glen, CA) is analyzing the friendliness and accessibility of supports for student parents as well as creating a multimedia outreach campaign to reach student parents with the goal of increasing college and community support.



Montgomery College (Montgomery County, MD) is enhancing its student parent identification, data collection, and analysis processes and creating a professional development curriculum for staff and faculty related to student parent rights and best practices.



Faculty as Change Agents for Student Parent Achievement



In July 2024, Ascend convened Postsecondary Leadership Circle Activation Fund (PLCAF) Partners and experts to engage in knowledge and resource sharing to help plan and implement their systemic, measurable, and sustainable Fund strategies. Select convening sessions focused on leveraging faculty support to increase persistence and completion for parenting students, including a designing thinking activity to share tactics for faculty engagement.

Key Tactics

Gaining Faculty Buy-In

- Survey student parents about faculty engagement and share the findings.
- Uplift positive stories about faculty impact on student parents.
- Leverage faculty student parent champions to raise awareness with peers.
- Provide recognition and incentives to faculty who participate in student parent efforts.
- Invite faculty to attend events focused on student parents and their families.

Creating Effective Professional Development

- Hold faculty focus groups to gather feedback on curriculum and training modality.
- Design and facilitate training with student parents.
- Include student parent statistics and focus on the opportunity to impact academic outcomes.
- Lead with empathy and highlight real-world student parent experiences.
- Provide faculty with student parent and peer mentors.

Leveraging Faculty Experience

- Collaborate with faculty to solve challenges with student parent accommodations.
- Partner with faculty to create a student parent feedback loop that informs policy and pedagogy.
- Develop a community of practice with faculty to identify promising practices.
- Create an evidence-based pilot with faculty to capture the impact of interventions on student parent outcomes.

Positioning Student Parents in Faculty Relations

- Leverage graduate student parents who are teaching and research assistants.
- Arrange student parent presentations during faculty gatherings.
- Create paid student parent positions that liaise with faculty.
- Organize student parent-faculty relationship building activities.
- Establish a student parent-faculty committee.
