As part of Jeremiah Program's comprehensive Strategic Planning process with Bridgespan in 2024, we identified five key strategic priorities that will shape our organization's future over the next five years 2025-2029. This strategic review process revealed an opportunity to significantly expand our interactive rental platform initiative beyond its original scope in the 2024 grant cycle. By integrating insights from our successful renter education program—which demonstrates how technology-enabled, mixed-delivery methods can create meaningful impact—we've reimagined the platform's potential to advance our mission across multiple priorities.

The platform has evolved from an initial proof point into a cornerstone investment that will leverage technology and product investments over the next five years to:

- Create an AI-enabled mobile application that connects alumni, current participants, and resources across the JP network, building on our proven model of combining personal support with accessible digital tools
- Enhance our housing stability initiatives by facilitating connections between JP
 mothers and public/private housing partners in non-residential cities, extending the
 reach of our successful renter education program that currently serves hundreds of
 families across nine U.S. cities
- Enable data-driven storytelling that amplifies our families' voices and experiences, incorporating the pre- and post-education survey methodology that has demonstrated increased knowledge and self-confidence among participants
- Support comprehensive data disaggregation by race, gender, and parental status to better illuminate and address disparities, ensuring our programs effectively serve all family circumstances
- Drive our holistic impact measurement approach by implementing the same rigorous evaluation methods that have proven successful in our renter education program

This strategic integration allows us to build upon our demonstrated success in creating safe spaces for learning and support while scaling our impact through technology. The enhanced scope directly aligns with our commitment to building sustainable solutions for economic mobility and disrupting generational poverty.

We see this expanded platform as a catalyst for creating greater long-term value for our community while strengthening our ability to attract and engage champions committed to systems change. The platform will serve as a foundation for JP's future growth, enabling us

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to scale our proven approaches through a train-the-trainer model and reach more families across our network.

Based on both the strategic priorities and the renter education model's success metrics, here are key outcomes that we anticipate will define success for the expanded JP technology platform, over the next five years:

Transformational Outcomes:

- Enable 75% of JP alumni to remain actively engaged through the AI-powered mobile platform, fostering peer connections and resource sharing that extend beyond program completion
- Increase stable housing placement rates by 40% in non-residential cities through streamlined public/private partnership management and automated matching systems
- Generate a 50% increase in JP mothers sharing their stories and experiences through the platform, leading to enhanced advocacy and policy influence

Operational Excellence:

- Reduce staff administrative time by 60% through automated data collection and reporting systems, allowing more time for direct family support
- Achieve comprehensive data tracking across all five program pillars (college access, early childhood education, housing, career training, and community) with 100% demographic disaggregation
- Enable real-time impact measurement across all JP locations, with quarterly insight reports automatically generated for both internal improvement and external stakeholders

Community Impact:

- Scale our proven training models to reach 3x more families through technologyenabled delivery methods
- Create a searchable knowledge base of family insights and success stories that inform program improvements and policy advocacy

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 Establish measurable baselines for economic mobility milestones achieved by JP families, tracked longitudinally through the platform

These outcomes reflect our goal of not just building a rental program, but a larger technology platform, creating an ecosystem that amplifies our impact, scales our proven approaches, and advances our mission of disrupting generational poverty.
