"My name is Desiree Thornton and I've been with UTEC since 2018. I was a young single mom of 2, about to be 3 children at only 20 years old. When I first started at UTEC I was doing a lot of mattress recycling work in the Transformational Beginnings program that UTEC has you start with before entering workforce programming. Transformational Beginnings showed me what it was like to have structure with having to be on time and to have consistency while staying committed to the work that we were doing. The Transitional Coaches and Streetworkers I met helped me right away by attending court dates with me, getting my ID and my driver's license, and helping me earn my high school equivalency. Juggling my work life with my children made my life very complicated and busy at times. but UTEC was able to provide sustainability to me through helping me with child care through the 2Gen Center once my newborn, Athena, was born. Once I made my way to the workforce program, I started out doing woodworking for my first year at UTEC, where I learned more of a sense of work ethic while also learning how to correct my own mistakes while holding my head up high. I took a short break from UTEC after woodworking while still utilizing the mental health services that UTEC provided to me through counseling, and I was able to come back shortly after to be in Organizing at UTEC. In Organizing, I learned how to use my voice and advocate for myself and others in my community. I learned how to make a positive impact for myself and others. UTEC's mental health staff made sure I got into counseling right away, too. It really helped me learn coping skills that helped me deal with what I was going through at the time. I think this support helped me get back on my feet so I could learn how to walk on my own in this life.

All along my side through struggles, and through the good and bad, the 2Gen Center was always there for me. When Athena was only 2 years old she had early intervention involved and I was not always able to be there for those appointments. When I was not able to be there, Rula from the 2Gen Center would always sit in on early intervention appointments with Athena to take notes just as I her mother would, and she would give them to me at the end of the day and tell me how the session went; it was like I never missed a beat. If I am greatly thankful for anything since I've had children it would be UTEC and them being such a big support system. They have helped me be able to help myself and my family flourish so beautifully. My experience helped me come out of my shell, too. I learned how to speak up and advocate for myself. Now I can teach my daughters these valuable life skills and be the best role model for them possible."
