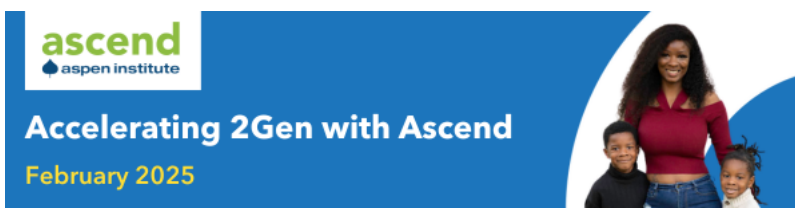

A Novel, Multigenerational Model to Reduce Maternal and Infant Health Disparities

According to a [study published in NEJM Catalyst Innovations in Care Delivery](#), women who were cared for by the MedStar Health D.C. Safe Babies Safe Moms program have better outcomes in pregnancy, delivery, and postpartum. Additionally, the study showed that Black patients cared for by the program were also less likely to have low or very low birthweight babies or preterm birth than Black or White patients who received prenatal care elsewhere.
